ELIZABETH HELMS director; Gold Coast Concert Chorus

As conductor, music director, collaborative pianist, music educator, and church musician, Elizabeth Helms plays an integral part in building and sustaining a strong, vibrant musical community in Ventura County. She currently works with Gold Coast Concert Chorus, Church of the Foothills, the CLU Chapel Singers, and in her private music studio. Elizabeth received her Bachelor of Music from the University of Redlands, and Master of Arts from California Lutheran University in 2005. Ms. Helms worked with the Ventura College Music Department and



with Dr. Burns Taft as Principal Collaborative Pianist and Associate Conductor of the Master Chorale of Ventura County, later reformed as the Master Chorale of the Pacific Shores Philharmonic, from 1981 to 2019.

The 2022-23 season marks her 23rd year with the Gold Coast Concert Chorus. A recent highlight of the 2020 season, as members of the GCCC traveled to New York City and perform onstage at Carnegie Hall in a concert titled, "Who are the Brave: Music in Honor of President's Day." Under Elizabeth Helms' direction the GCCC, currently in its 32nd season, has had continuing success, including exciting musical collaborations, travel opportunities, and, most importantly, continuing successful concert seasons. Gold Coast is something of a family affair for her. Ms. Helms was principal accompanist for the GCCC from 2000 to 2005 under the direction of her late husband, Kenneth Helms, she became Artistic Director in 2006, and is pleased to have daughter Jessica Helms as Principal Collaborative Pianist and Assistant Artistic Director.

Creating challenging learning and performance opportunities in a positive, generous environment, and helping students of all ages to find and nurture their musical voice is the focus of her work with the students of Ventura College, the singers in her choirs, and the many piano and vocal students she has taught. Ms. Helms' deep belief in the value of music education and her enthusiasm for the collaborative arts makes her sought after as teacher, accompanist, and conductor.

VALDIS JANSONS baritone

Latvian baritone Valdis Jansons started his musical studies as a violinist. After graduating from Riga Music College, he continued his studies at Conservatorio Arrigo Boito di Parma, Italy, obtaining bachelor's and master's degrees. Mr. Jansons made his opera debut in 2004 under the direction of Antonello Allemandi. He has won many international competitions, including Giuseppe Di Stefano (Trapani, Italy, 2006) and the As.Li.Co (Como, Italy, 2009), Riccardo Zandonai (Riva del Garda, Italy, 2013), Maurizio Quintieri (Cosenza, Italy, 2014).



Mr. Jansons has sung 65 roles in more than 70 theaters worldwide, including the Teatro Alla Scala in Berg's Lulu, directed by Peter Stein and conducted by Daniele Gatti in 2011, Teatro Carlo Felice di Genova as Capulet in Romeo et Juliette, directed by Jean Louis Grinda and conducted by Fabio Luisi in 2012, Teatro Filarmonico di Verona, Teatro Regio di Parma, São Carlos Theater of Lisbon, Moscow's Bolshoi Theater, Theater an der Wien, Teatro San Carlo di Napoli, Lincoln Center, NCPA in Beijing. In the last years, he appeared in the title role of Verdi's Nabucco at the Latvian National Opera (2019), Ramiro in Ravel's L'Heure Espagnole in theaters of Brescia, Pavia, Como and Brescia in Italy (2019-2020), made his debut as Tonio in Leoncavallo's Pagliacci at the Slovenian National Opera (2020), Zurga in Bizet's The Pearl Fishers at Teatro Campoamor de Oviedo, Spain (2021). In 2022 he performed the soloist part in Orff's Carmina Burana at Opéra de Saint-Etienne, France, and at Granada Theatre in Santa Barbara, CA, USA; he appeared as Anckaström (Renato) in Verdi's Un Ballo in Maschera at Opera på Skäret.

In 2023 Mr. Jansons took part in the concerts "Echoes of Ancient Tang Poems" with the Philadelphia Orchestra at the Verizon Hall at the Kimmel Center in Philadelphia and the Alice Tully Hall at the Lincoln Center in New York. In June, he returns to Opéra de Saint-Etienne, France, to interpret the title role in Verdi's Macbeth. As a concert singer, he performed Mahler's Lieder eines Fahrenden Gesellen, Brahms's Vier ernste Gesänge, Mussorgsky's Songs and Dances of Death, and an extensive series of Neapolitan songs, which play a particular role in his artistic expression.

ABOUT THE PERFORMERS

BRENT WILSON conductor

Brent Wilson is a Los Angeles-based tenor, conductor and stage director, and is the Department Chair of Performing Arts and Director of Voice, Choirs, Opera and Musical Theatre at Ventura College, resident guest director at Viterbo University, and director of choral studies at University of California, Santa Barbara. Locally as a conductor, Wilson served as Assistant Conductor and Chorus Master of Opera Santa Barbara for over twenty productions and conducted productions of The Consul and Don Pasquale. He has appeared as



guest conductor for the UCSB Orchestra and Opera, receiving top prizes for collegiate opera production from the National Opera Association for the production of Twelfth Night.

Wilson has worked with choral groups such as the Grammy-nominated ensemble Boston Baroque, Handel and Haydn Society, Handel Oratorio Society(Chicago), Long Beach Camerata, and Santa Barbara Master Chorale, and opera ensembles including Boston Lyric Opera, Maine Grand Opera, Opera Santa Barbara, Granite State Opera, Chicago Opera Theater, Lyric Opera of Chicago, and Opera Theatre Saint Louis.

Additionally, he has been on faculty at the Tanglewood Institute through Boston University, Augustana College, and Viterbo University where the National Opera Association awarded his production of Trouble in Tahiti a 3rd prize in Division I collegiate productions. He is a member of the National Opera Association, American Choral Directors Association, National Association of Teachers of Singing, and champions the training of young singers and has students in the Broadway tours of School of Rock, Rock of Ages, and Hamilton. He has recently embarked on a project to rediscover and remount works by Gian Carlo Menotti that have been lost since their debuts on NBC and CBS in the '60s and '70s. Wilson received Voice Performance degrees from Augustana College (B.A.) and Boston University School of Music (M.M.) and also holds degrees in Computer Science/Mathematics from Augustana. In his free time, Wilson likes to compete in marathons and other endurance sports and has completed five Ironman competitions, fourteen marathons, and most recently ran across the Italian Dolomites Alta Via I 75 mile trail in a weekend.
