#### **PROGRAM NOTES**

Tonight's concert begins with a performance by Ventura College's percussion ensemble. The first selection is "Loud and Soft" by Molly Joyce, a composer who explores disability as a creative source following an injury to her left hand. Joyce's album *Perspective* addresses themes of access and care through interviews with disabled individuals. Composer Toby Fox is known for his work in the gaming industry. His "Fallen Down (Reprise)" is from the soundtrack of the video game *Undertale*. This arrangement for percussion is by Ventura College student Kai Olmos.

Benjamin Britten's Simple Symphony is based on eight themes he wrote between the ages of 10 and 13. Completed when he was twenty, Simple Symphony received its first performance in 1934, conducted by the composer. Dedicated to his childhood viola teacher Audrey Alston, the piece reflects Britten's fondness for the playful melodies and vibrant rhythms of youth, seen in many of his later works for children and adults.

The concert title derives from Alexander Pushkin's poem "Ruslan and Lyudmila," which inspired **Mikhail Glinka**'s 1842. *Ruslan and Lyudmila*'s overture opens with a lively frenzy in the strings and features contrasting lyrical themes that evoke the opera's mystical atmosphere. A descending whole tone scale in the low brass signifies the opera's evil sorcerer, propelling the piece to a rousing conclusion.

Franz Schubert's Symphony No. 9 in C major, known as "The Great," has become a cornerstone of the orchestral repertoire due to its lyrical themes, energetic motifs, and Schubert's deep understanding of orchestration. Originally dubbed "The Great C major" to distinguish it from his Symphony No. 6, referred to as "the Little C major," the subtitle stuck and is now commonly assumed to be a reference to the symphony's grandeur and majesty. Composed in 1825, this symphony did not receive a professional performance until a decade after Schubert's death in 1828.

We invite you to join us tomorrow afternoon at 3:00 PM for a concert by Ventura College's Chamber Music Program. For both of this weekend's performances, attendees can enjoy the art of celebrated Santa Barbara artist Wendy Brewer showcased in the Yunker lobby. Brewer's art reflects her lifelong passion for creativity and deep connection to nature. Her mosaics fuse found objects with a blend of materials (including clay, crystals, beach glass, and tempered glass) capturing her love for music, the ocean and her belief in the transformative power of artistic expression.
